I am writing to express my heartfelt gratitude to the ESHG Educational Committee for selecting me for the 2025 Mentorship Programme. After completing my training in Medical Genetics, I recently joined the Clinical Genetics Department at ULS Coimbra, Portugal, as a consultant in the Oncogenetics team. I am committed to deepening my expertise and enhancing care for patients with hereditary cancer syndromes.

As part of the mentorship, I spent a week in Stockholm under the guidance of Prof. Svetlana Bajalica-Lagercrantz and her team at the Karolinska Comprehensive Cancer Center (KCCC), Karolinska University Hospital, and Karolinska Institutet. During this time, I had the opportunity to experience all facets of KCCC's work, particularly within the Centrum för Personanpassad Cancerprevention. I attended multidisciplinary meetings, participated in patient consultations, and observed research group discussions.
