

Presentation of European Board of Medical Genetics

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Background

The EBMG (ex ad hoc committee) was formed in June 2012 (ESHG Nuremberg) and became a legal entity in June 2014 (ESHG Milan), a non-for profit association under Austrian

The EBMG is set up to serve *the needs of patients who use genetic services* in Europe through ensuing *good standards of practice* in three professional branches:

- Clinical laboratory geneticists (CLGs)
- Genetic nurses and genetic counsellors (GNGCs)
- Medical geneticists (MGs)

The 1st **EBMG** General Assembly, June 2014 set out to:

- write a curriculum for each professional branch
- determine levels of education needed to ensure safe practice
- define the steps of an European accreditation system
- create a website





Clinical Laboratory Geneticists

Concerning our goal – EU-recognition of our profession:

"Green Paper" = Professional Qualifications Directive = EU Directive 2013/55/EU was implemented by EU-parliament!

9 EU countries need to have CLG registered; Then we can ask for EU-wide recognition. Yet we have 10/9.

There are 10 countries

Denmark, Finland, France,
Greece, Hungary, Italy, Latvia,
Poland, Portugal, and Slovenia
which have CLG state
recognized as national
profession

Besides:

States to be members of EU soon – with recognition: **North-Macedonia**

States not members of EU – with recognition **Switzerland UK**

In 2023:

New attempt is being started to contact national EC members and to ask them to support us.

- Fees are now 180 Euro for 5 year registration (new)
 100 Euro for 5 year re-registration

New routes

- Grandfather clauses were available to a number of experienced health professionals who did not have an
 accredited Master level degree who were working as genetic counsellors before the creation of EBMG. These
 are now closed to new applicants, except Grandfather Clause B (Norwegian genetic counselling training
 program).
- New routes have now been created to be as inclusive as possible and opened to a wide number of professionals trained to an MSc level wishing to register with the EBMG:



- Spain, MSc in Genetic Counselling at Universitat Pompeu Fabra, Barcelona (graduates from 2012 valid until october 2021)




