- Delegate of ESHG-Young in **EJHG** Magdalena Mroczek and Delia Sabau






Collaborations with AfSHG, ASHG and HGSA

- The newly created chair-elect position allows for smoother transitions, with Silvia Kalantari appointed to serve as the Chair from June 2025.








The definition of ESHG Trainee

- The **definition of "young"** has changed during the years (it used to be agerelated): we now define that as people who are Bachelors, Masters, PhD students, undertaking post-graduate clinical training (i.e. resident doctors), or within 4 years since last post-graduate qualification. People **without a permanent position**. In line with the "Early career award" definition.
- Issues with official outreach to this specific subgroup of individuals: ESHG trainee tier does not necessarily include all people in training (and DOES not include people who recently completed their clinical training).









What should we do for the future?

- If we cannot have the list of the people represented within the ESHG, we cannot forward the newsletter/allow to participate in our networking dinner events/guarantee voting rights during elections.
- For **this year's elections** we have asked that candidates were either ESHG trainees' members of could provide evidence of being in training (still in training at the time of elections, since the mandate is for four years).
